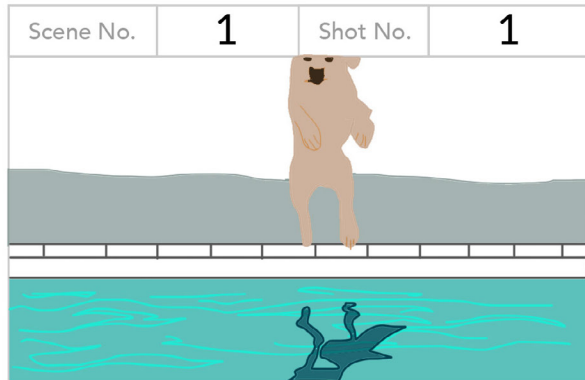

Dog Blanket for an ad on social media using product photos as validation

Title: Collage Dog Blanket Ad. 20 Second Version

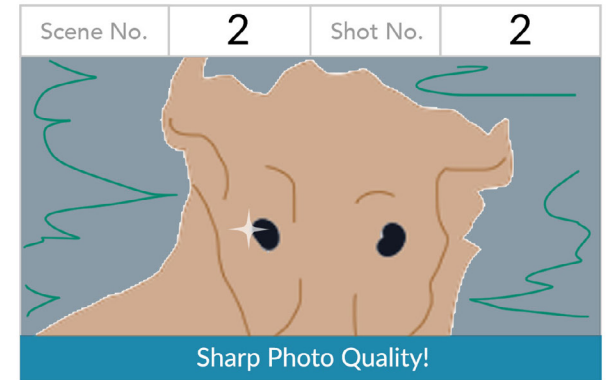

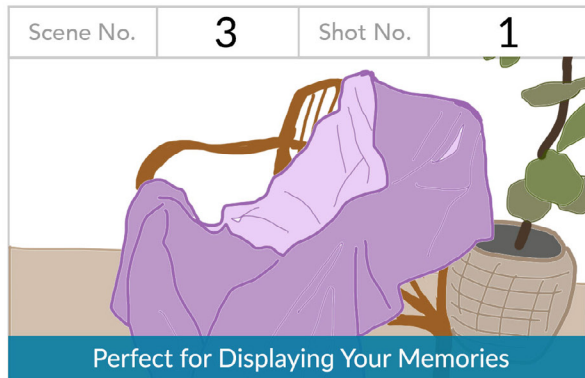
Beginning with the video of the golden retriever, framed seconds before the dog jumps into the water. Once the dog jumps into the water cue splash sound. Transition visual to still photo of pool dog, with the sound of a camera shutter snap.



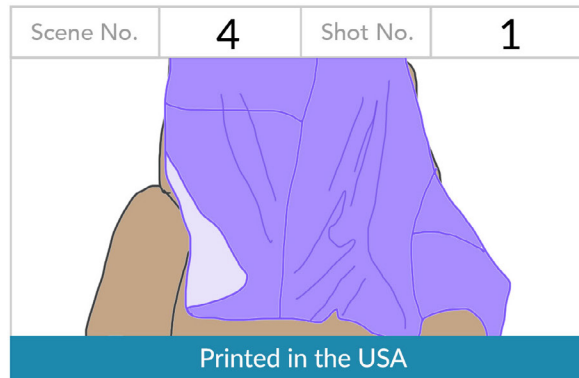
Immediately post shutter snap, begin jingle timed with a zoom out to photo of child holding dog blanket. Pop up from the bottom dark teal text block banner. Roll text down from top. Fade out text box, then the rest of the image to a dog photo.



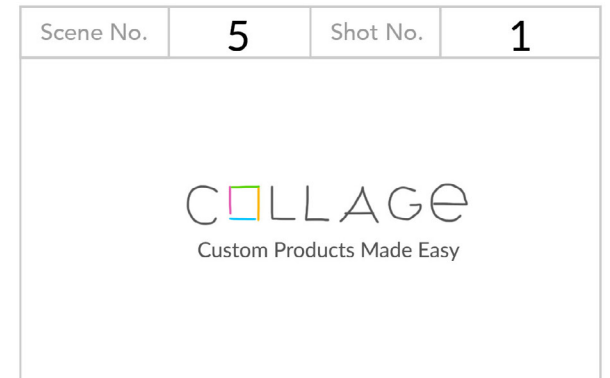
Ken Burns's effect of zooming out of dog photo. Pop up teal box and roll down text. Post text roll out, include twinkle sound and twinkle graphic to the dogs eye. Fade to white. Takes 4 seconds.



Fade in image. Upon image 100% visibility pop up dark teal block banner. Roll down text Ken Burns slow panning from left to right. Fade out image, keeping text bar. Should take 4 seconds.



Fade in image and roll down text in text bar. Text completes roll down as image opacity reaches 100%. Pan photo right to left (Ken Burns-y). Fade to White. Should take 3 seconds.



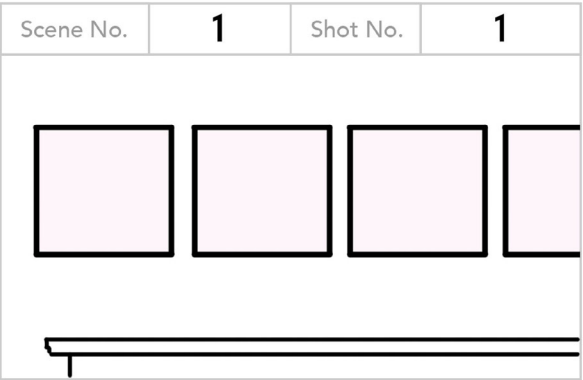
Fade in logo and tagline over the course of a second. Hold for one second as jingle ends. Leave logo on screen for one second. End Video. Should take 4 seconds long.

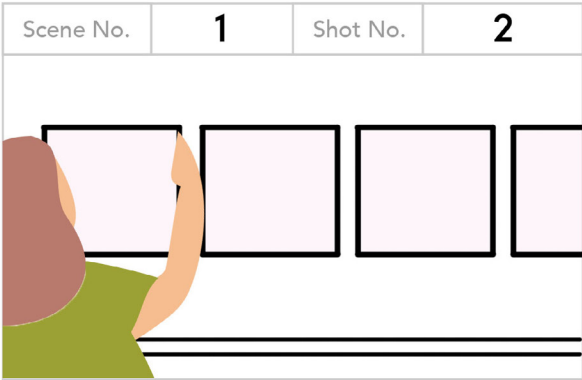
New product feature video

Title: Collage Mixtile Video

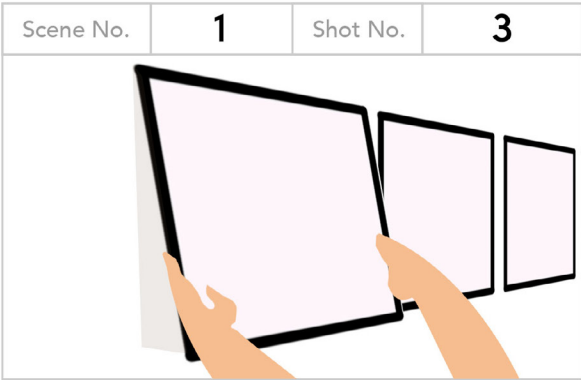
Page: 1/1



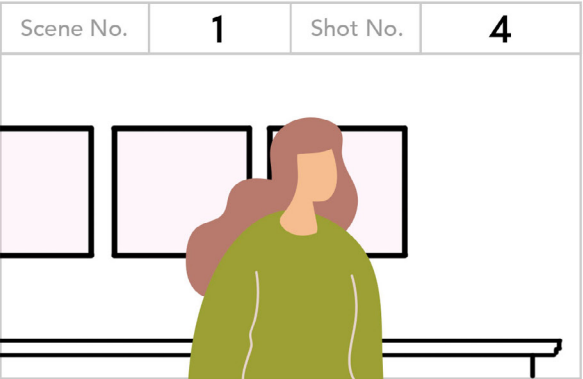
Start on the left side of a mixtile 5 wall line up, console table/mantle below, to show depth and scale.
This will be the standard Camera 1 angle.



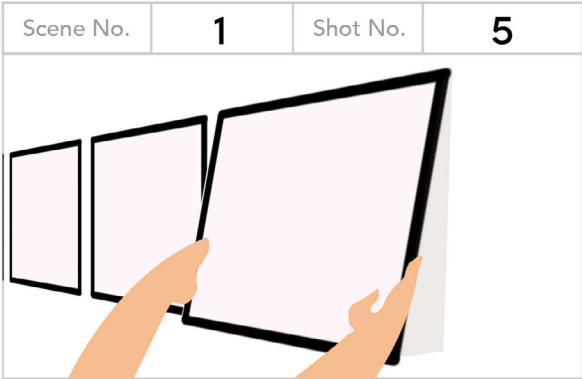
Enter actor from off screen, who grabs the mixtile on the wall on the far left



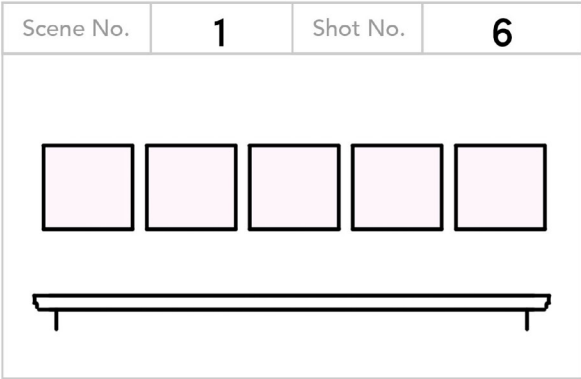
Zoom in on left side of the mixtile as it's being removed from the wall (bottom first).



Back to Camera 1
Follow actor as they walk to the right of the mixtile layout



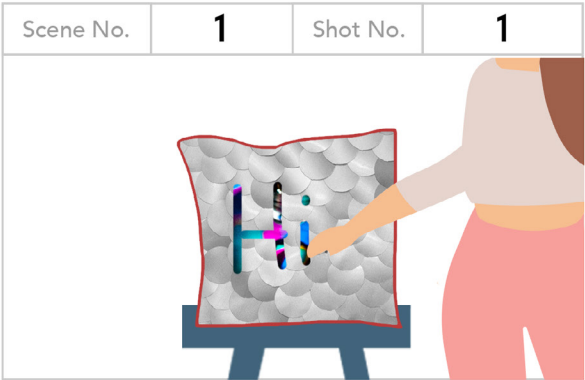
Zoom in on right side of the mixtile as it's being replaced on the wall (top first).



Return to camera one as actor walks off screen. Camera zooms out to show total line up of the mixtiles

Product feature video for texture detail and alternative uses



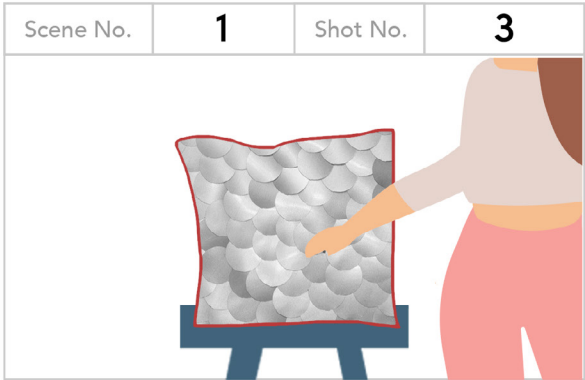
Start with Pillow propped up on a stool or on white, head on. Model runs hand over the sequins . writing phrases like 'hi' or face. Model then reveals as much of the printed image with two hand swipes





Model runs hands over the sequins to quickly show design and hide it.





Model then "resets" the pillow and hides the entire image.

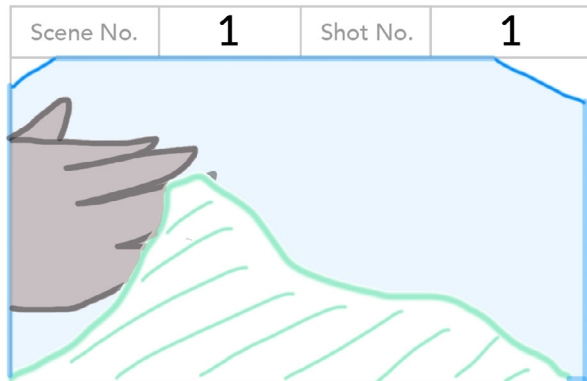

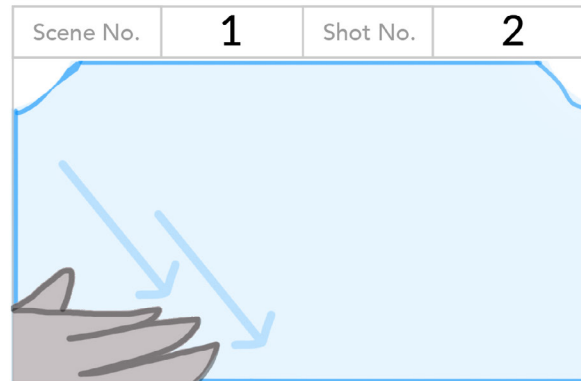
Product texture and backing detail short

Title: **Collage Blanket B Roll 1**

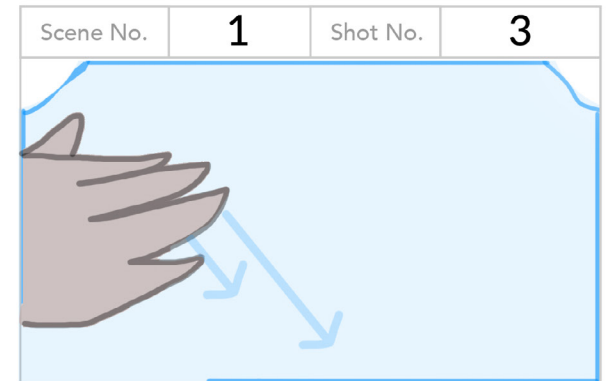
Page: **1/1**



Start with a close up on hand on a blanket, a corner of the blanket folded upon itself.
Focus on the blanket backing texture



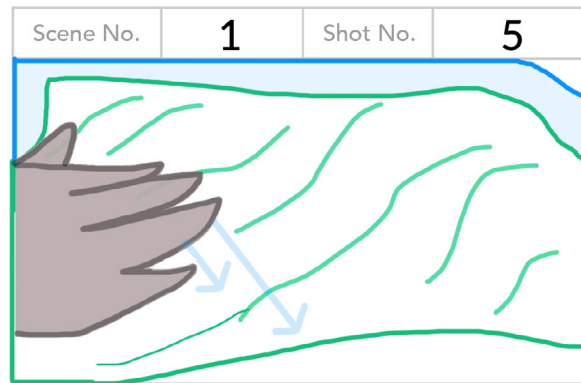
Moving the hand underneath the blanket fold, move the hand downward until the blanket shows no more backing



Use hand to smooth out any remaining wrinkles.
Focus on the printed blanket detail and texture



After smoothing out the final blanket wrinkle, use hand to pull back up the corner of the blanket, focusing on the the backing detail, thickness and texture. Pull up until you can see the end of the blanket



Use hand to smooth out backing wrinkles and focus on the ruffled texture.

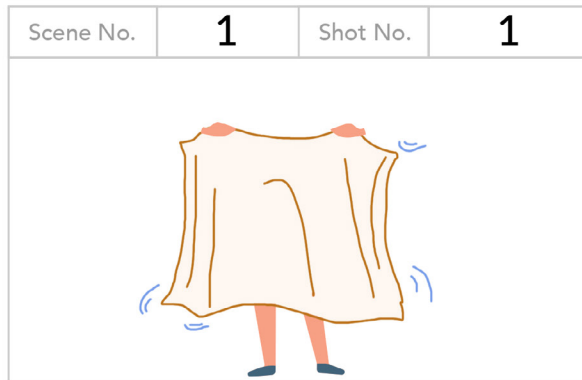

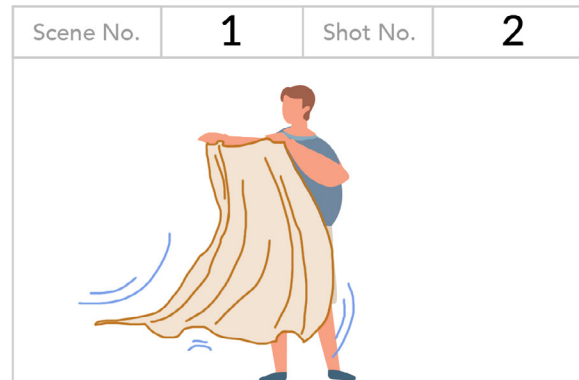
Product detail for blanket weight, heft and maneuverability

Title: Collage Blanket B Roll 2

Page: 1/1



Start with model holding blanket above their head, shaking the blanket side to side.



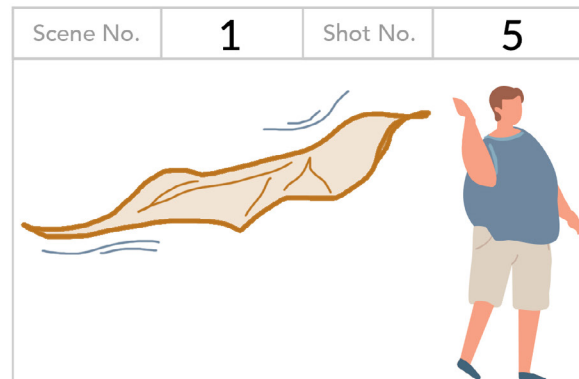
The model will then move the blanket below their head to shake the blanket slowly (2-3 times), to try and show some of the blanket underside (similar to a parachute from gym class)



In a fluid motion, take the blanket and flip behind the model almost like a cape.



Model quickly wraps blanket around their torso like a cloak. Model smiles :)



Model takes off blanket and releases it behind them. Then walks off screen.

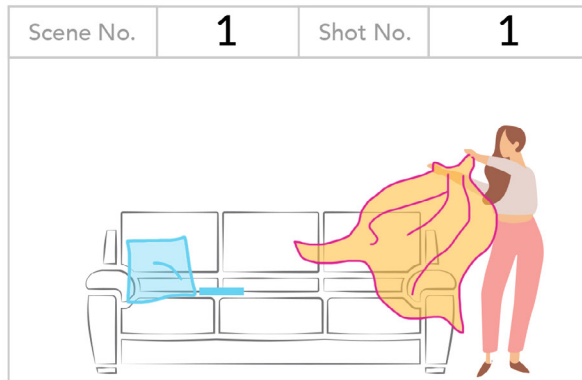

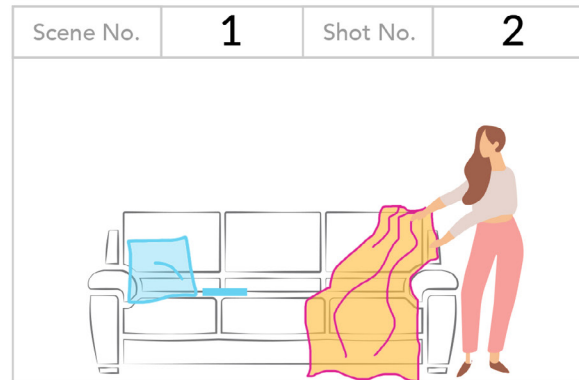
Product use case video for display of product weight and capabilities

Title: Collage Blanket B Roll 3

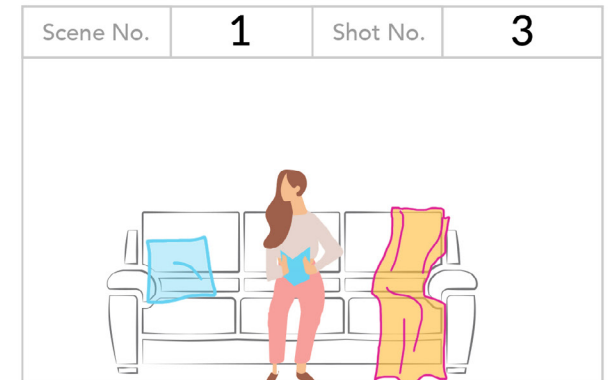

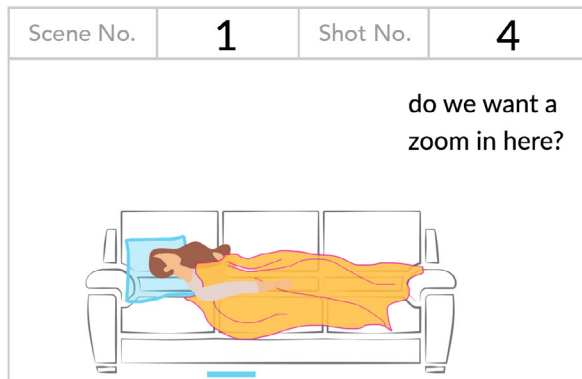
Begin with model coming into frame and shaking blanket out over the couch, demonstrating the heft of the blanket. Book is next to pillow on couch.
Roughly 5-8 seconds



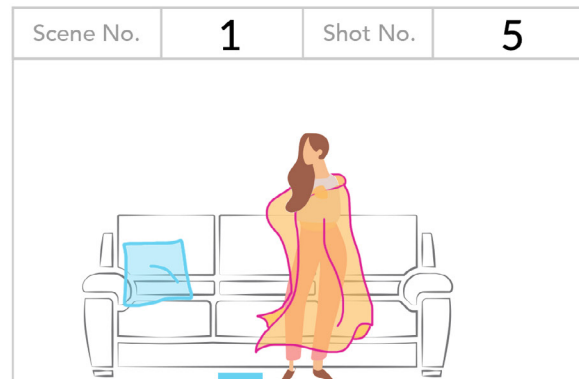
Model transitions from shaking out blanket to laying it over the end of the couch, as if displaying the blanket. Model smooths out blanket wrinkles.
Roughly 3 seconds



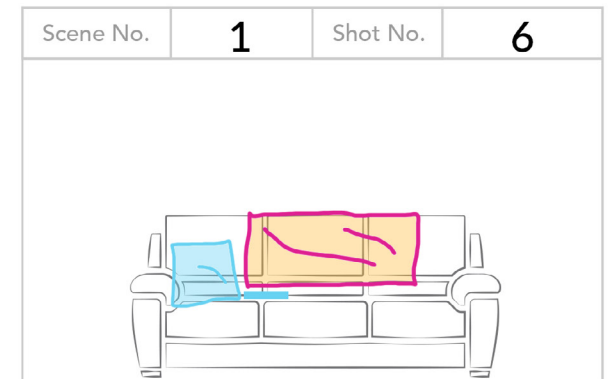
Model then goes to sit on the couch and pick up book to begin reading it.
Roughly 3 seconds



Model looks at pillow, then at the blanket. Sighs then puts the book on the floor, grabs blanket and gets comfortable
Roughly 4 seconds



Model shifts, sits up, and wraps blanket around self, stands up, and neatly puts blanket back on couch. Placing book back next to the pillow
Roughly 5 seconds



Model then walks off screen while camera rests on blanket on couch.
Roughly 3 seconds

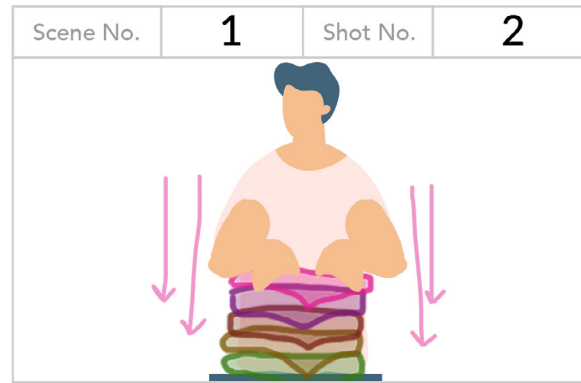
Product video displaying stack weight and display capabilities

Title: Collage Blanket B Roll 4

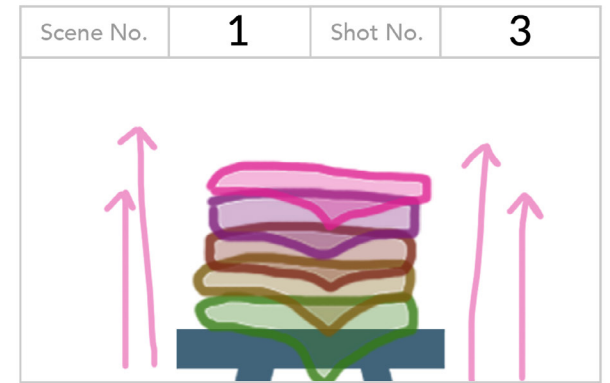
Page: 1/1



Begin with model folding blanket and stacking it on other stacked blankets*
Roughly 3-5 seconds



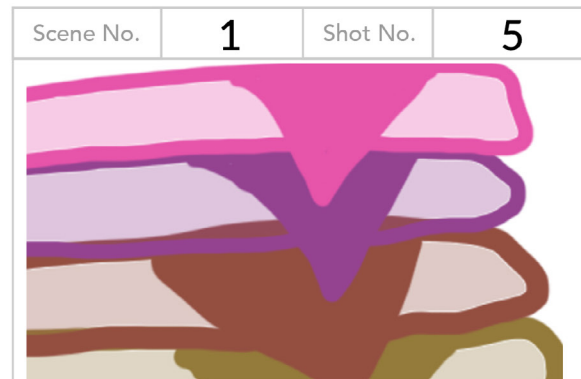
Zoom in on the blanket pile as the model pushes on the blankets a couple times
Roughly 2-3 seconds



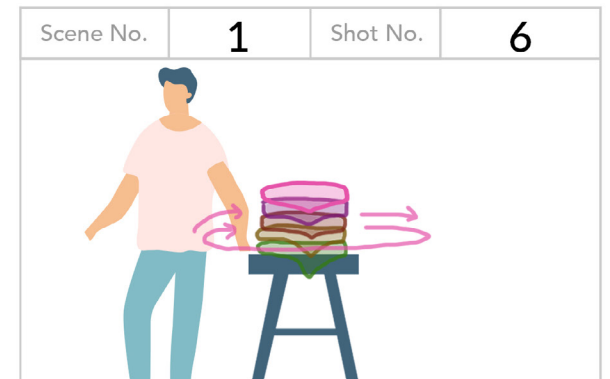
Focus on the blankets as they begin to rise
Roughly 1-3 seconds



While focused on the blanket stack, rotate it to the back side of the stack, where the camera will focus on the folded corners of blankets where the back texture and printing will be visible. Roughly 3 seconds.



Zoom in on the textures while panning down, across all the backing textures.
Roughly 5-8 seconds



Zoom back out, as model walks by and gently spins the stool while the blanket pile spins
End on a few seconds of spinning blanket pile
Roughly 5-8 seconds

**stacking blankets on a stool, that's on a lazy susan might make this easier to film*
